BIOGRAPHY

Born in Acre, deep in the Amazon rainforest, to Minervina Félis de Lima and Domingos da Silva, a Peruvian caboclo, he is perhaps the first artist of popular origin (...) to gain nationwide media attention, as well as recognition in specialized foreign media.

He began painting in Fortaleza (CE), where he had lived since 1935, working small jobs as a shoemaker, tinker, welder, mason, carpenter, and wall painter. What he liked most, however, "was drawing with fresh green grass picked on the spot, and white and red bricks (because I didn't have paint at that time) on the walls of fishermen's houses. (...) His large Amazonian birds, marine figures, and dragons were first seen this way by the Swiss critic and painter Jean Pierre Chabloz during his first stay in Ceará between 1943 and 1944.

"Those fish..." Chico told me, "no one can name them, because every day I bring out a different fish: my head is full of fish."

In 1945, when he exhibited in Rio at the Askanazy Gallery, critic Ruben Navarra observed: "I must say that the gouaches of this indigenous artist are something very serious. In Brazilian art, only Cícero Dias, ten years ago, gave me such a powerful impression of lyrical naivety applied to painting."

The first absences of Chabloz from Brazil in the 1940s corresponded to Chico abandoning painting, which he resumed whenever the Swiss painter returned to Fortaleza. On one of his returns in 1959, Chabloz sought to encourage Chico once again, obtaining a job for him as an assistant to the rector of the Federal University of Ceará, which essentially meant providing him a space to paint and reflect on his work.

At the University Art Museum, Chico created the large series of gouaches that are still in its collection today.







Established in 2004 in São Paulo, Brazil, Galeria Estação inaugurated a curatorial program serving a wide-reaching community of noncanonical artistic voices. By creating trans-generational bridges between emerging contemporary and pioneering self-taught artists, Galeria Estação has inspired an integrative network of creative figures and makers from varied geographies and educational backgrounds.

Since 2008, the gallery's innovative artistic program, housed in a state-of-the-art architectural building, has exhibited contemporary Brazilian artists whose cultural backgrounds and vernacular practices complement the primacy of self-taught art —examining the country's under represented artistic styles, working methods, and historical narratives and legacies.

Galeria Estação's artistic director and founder. Vilma Eid. in collaboration with a distinguished group of invited guest curators, have proposed unexpected dialogues in presentations that have transcended traditional accounts of the development of abstract and figural genres in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, initiating the past and present of Brazilian art. As a result. Galeria Estação is an institutional reference in Brazil, a force for preserving Latin American memories and narratives otherwise dismissed, marginalized, or overlooked in the historiographies of Brazilian art.

Galeria Estação advances its mission to provide unprecedented opportunities for viewers to experience expansive local and global visions of Brazilian art.
