ARTIST'S PORTFOLIO

Cícero Alves dos Santos, known as Véio, is an iconic figure in Brazilian folk art and a significant contemporary artist.

A self-taught master of wood sculpture, his work transcends the boundaries between folk and contemporary art, merging the memory of traditions with vibrant and modern expressiveness.

His creative process is visceral and intuitive, marked by a sensitive dialogue with his materials. Véio uses logs, roots, and pieces of wood found in nature, respecting their natural forms and textures.

He believes that the wood already holds the figures he seeks to reveal, and with simple tools like a pocketknife, he transforms these materials into enigmatic sculptures.

His works navigate between the figurative and the abstract, creating fantastic, anthropomorphic, and hybrid beings that evoke both collective memories and contemporary narratives.

Véio's artistic research connects oral histories, traditions, and the imagination of Brazil's Northeast with universal themes.

His sculptures, often painted in vibrant, intense colors, preserve the cultural memory of the sertão while exploring symbolism and layers of interpretation.

These pieces are imbued with poetry and critique, questioning the relationships between humanity and the natural world, between past and present.

Recognized nationally and internationally, Véio occupies a unique position in the art world.

His works are part of major public collections in Brazil and abroad, establishing him as an essential voice in understanding the richness of folk culture and its profound connection to contemporary art.



THE GALLERY

Established in 2004 in São Paulo, Brazil, Galeria Estação inaugurated a curatorial program serving a wide-reaching community of noncanonical artistic voices. By creating trans-generational bridges between emerging contemporary and pioneering self-taught artists, Galeria Estação has inspired an integrative network of creative figures and makers from varied geographies and educational backgrounds.

Since 2008, the gallery's innovative artistic program, housed in a state-of-the-art architectural building, has exhibited contemporary Brazilian artists whose cultural backgrounds and vernacular practices complement the primacy of self-taught art —examining the country's under represented artistic styles, working methods, and historical narratives and legacies.

Galeria Estação's artistic director and founder, Vilma Eid, in collaboration with a distinguished group of invited guest curators, have proposed unexpected dialogues in presentations that have transcended traditional accounts of the development of abstract and figural genres in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, initiating the past and present of Brazilian art. As a result, Galeria Estação is an institutional reference in Brazil, a force for preserving Latin American memories and narratives otherwise dismissed, marginalized, or overlooked in the historiographies of Brazilian art.

Galeria Estação advances its mission to provide unprecedented opportunities for viewers to experience expansive local and global visions of Brazilian art.
